

Exploring the Role of Pakistan's Higher Education Industry in China-Pakistan Cultural Exchange

Tian Xuefeng (2021) pointed that the Pakistani government started independently developing school education on the preexisting foundation after the great partition of India in 1947. Ashraf Muhammad Azeem, Yang Meijia, and Zhang Yufeng (2020) have observed that since the great partition of India in 1947, Pakistan has undergone various stages of reform, including initial attempts, legalization, and systematization, in order to establish a distinct internal and external governance system for higher education. However, in practice, the process of higher education governance reform in Pakistan has been characterized by significant delays, primarily due to the lack of decentralization of federal higher education governance power, stagnation in the reform of core governance institutions in colleges and universities, and persistent issues of low institutional autonomy and high accountability.

It is widely accepted that the quality of education in the country has been in sharp decline for many years and the lack of investment in the sector has been a major factor in this. In order to understand the current state of the higher education industry in Pakistan, One of the studies on the current higher education industry in Pakistan was conducted by Pervez hoodbhoy (2009), he pointed out that none of Pakistan's 50+ public universities comes even close to being a

university in the real sense of the word. Chen Hengmin and Gurza Ali Shahabuhari (2017) have observed that the current administrative organization and organizational system of higher education in Pakistan is characterized by certain features in terms of the origin, procedures, and standards of the establishment system of higher education in Pakistan. The study reveals that the establishment procedure of colleges and universities in Pakistan revolves around four key stages: application, examination, inspection, and empowerment, and is supported by a comprehensive set of systematic establishment standards, including the construction of teaching staff, standardization of equipment and venues, and prudent utilization of funds and management. Nadeem Omar Tarar. (2006) mentioned that higher education in Pakistan is being restructured as a result of the neoliberal reform currently in process. As with other areas, these reforms are also influencing ideas about the role of universities and the policy framework underlying higher education. But while the crisis of quantity and quality in university education needs to be addressed, the reform process emphasises privatisation and self-financing through higher fees. This shortsighted approach has dire social and political consequences and undermines the notion of higher education as a public good. According to Niazi, K., Shoaib, M., & Khalid, A. (2020), since the launch of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, cultural exchange between citizens of China and Pakistan has increased, and cooperation between the governments of the two countries has also been expanded. Through empirical research, it was found that although there is cultural diversity between China and Pakistan, both sides are willing to accept cultural diversity and work

for mutual benefit.

Tang Jun (2022) highlighted that the Belt and Road Initiative, launched by China, along with the steady advancement of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor, has elevated the bilateral relationship between the two nations to an “all-weather strategic partnership”. The political relations between China and Pakistan are amicable, and their collaboration in various areas such as economy, trade, culture, and education has increased significantly. A growing number of Pakistani educational institutions have initiated several educational and cultural cooperation and exchange programs with their counterparts in China, leading to the cultivation of numerous China-Pakistan friendly envoys. Furthermore, a considerable number of Pakistani students are seeking opportunities to pursue their academic aspirations in China while immersing themselves in the country's rich cultural heritage. Concurrently, the advancement of the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor has prompted Pakistani enterprises to concentrate their efforts within the region, which has subsequently resulted in a high demand for local talents possessing an in-depth understanding of Pakistan's regional languages and cultural nuances.

Kan Yue and Ma Wenting (2022) contend that current China-Pakistan higher education collaboration is plagued by a host of pressing issues that demand immediate attention concerning internal and external environmental factors, stakeholders, cooperative education, and linguistic connectivity. Moreover, practical obstacles, such as a complex and unpredictable political landscape, a narrow range of cooperative subjects, limited cooperation in running

educational institutions, and inadequate language proficiency, add to the complexity of this cooperation. Consequently, China-Pakistan higher education cooperation must proactively seek resolutions by increasing access to education, promoting multi-stakeholder collaboration, strengthening cooperative school-running initiatives, and accelerating the development of linguistic competencies. Du Jiang, Yu Haifeng & Wang Haiyan (2019) mentioned that the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor has created a novel avenue for fostering cultural industry cooperation between China and Pakistan, and even enabled the latter to go global and partake in international collaborative ventures. This paper conducts a comparative analysis of cultural resource endowments between the two nations, elucidates the foundational and cultural characteristics of cultural industry development in the economic corridor region, and explores the partnership pathways and modalities of cultural industry between China and Pakistan in the construction of the China-Pakistan economic corridor through a three-tier linkage cooperation mechanism comprising of enterprise, government, and society.

Thirdly, cooperation between higher education institutions in China and Pakistan on joint research projects is a key aspect of cultural exchange between the two countries. These projects provide an excellent platform for cultural exchange as they involve the exchange of ideas, knowledge, and experience between the two nations. Intercultural communication theory, which focuses on how people from different cultural backgrounds communicate, interact, and manage conflicts, provides a good framework for communication in joint research projects between China and Pakistan. Through this type of collaboration, the two

countries can not only generate new and innovative ideas and solutions, but also better understand the cultural differences between each other, which is beneficial for both sides.

Furthermore, higher education institutions can promote cultural exchange through a variety of cultural and educational activities, including lectures, seminars, film screenings, workshops, and other events. These activities are good ways for students from both countries to learn about each other's cultures, history, and customs. Additionally, Pakistan's higher education industry showcases the traditions, customs, and practices of both countries through cultural events, such as exhibitions, cultural festivals, and conferences. Effective cross-cultural communication is essential for establishing relationships and understanding between individuals and groups from different cultures. Therefore, cultural events organized by the higher education industry provide opportunities for people from both countries to learn about each other's cultures, arts, and traditions, and create a platform for individuals and organizations to establish meaningful connections, promote cultural exchange and cooperation, and mutual respect and appreciation.

In addition, Pakistan's higher education industry can play an important role in promoting cultural exchange between China and Pakistan by offering language courses. Language is an important aspect of any culture, with Chinese being the official language of China and Urdu being the official language of Pakistan. Although English is widely used in both countries, many people still cannot speak it fluently. This language barrier can lead to misunderstandings and communication problems, hindering cultural exchange.

Therefore, by offering Chinese language courses to Pakistani students, and vice versa, the higher education industry can facilitate cross-cultural communication between the two countries. Learning the language of another culture is an important step towards understanding its people and traditions.

In summary, Intercultural communication theory provides a good framework for promoting cultural exchange between China and Pakistan in light of the challenges faced by Pakistan's higher education industry, such as "insufficient funding, inadequate infrastructure, lack of quality assurance and accountability, and shortage of qualified teachers". In this framework, China and Pakistan can learn from each other. On the one hand, Pakistan's higher education institutions can take advantage of Intercultural communication opportunities to provide students with the knowledge, skills, and experiences needed to overcome cultural differences and engage with different viewpoints, better guiding the development of the higher education industry. On the other hand, in cross-cultural communication, China's cultural ideas, educational concepts, and social customs can also be transmitted to Pakistan, becoming an important part of the interaction and exchange between the two sides.

5. Conclusion

The relationship between China and Pakistan is one of the most important bilateral relationships in the world. Both countries enjoy strong mutual trust and respect, and the two

sides have developed a deep cooperation in the fields of politics, economy, culture and education. In recent years, China and Pakistan have made great progress in higher education cooperation, and the exchange of students and scholars has become increasingly frequent. This is an important part of the development of the bilateral relationship and provides an important platform for the two countries to strengthen their understanding of each other.

The Chinese government has already taken various measures to promote the cooperation between China and Pakistan in higher education. For example, the Chinese government has established a number of joint research and training centers in Pakistan, including the Confucius Institute and the China-Pakistan Joint Research and Training Center. The Confucius Institute has been providing Chinese language courses, cultural activities and other services to Pakistani students and scholars since its establishment in 2012. In addition, the Chinese government has also set up a number of scholarships for Pakistani students studying in China. These scholarships have made it easier for Pakistani students to study in China, and have increased the number of Pakistani students studying in China.

To further promote the exchange of students and scholars between China and Pakistan, the Chinese government should continue to implement the existing measures and take additional measures to improve the exchange of students and scholars. For example, the Chinese government should increase the number of scholarships available for Pakistani students and provide more financial assistance to Pakistani scholars visiting China for research. In addition, the Chinese

government should also promote the exchange of students and scholars by further developing the existing educational and research cooperation between the two countries. The Chinese government should also encourage more universities in China to sign cooperation agreements with Pakistani universities, and provide more opportunities for students and scholars from both countries to participate in joint educational and research activities.

Furthermore, the Chinese government should also take steps to strengthen the cultural exchanges between China and Pakistan. This can be done by encouraging universities in both countries to organize more cultural activities and events, such as lectures, seminars, film screenings, and art exhibitions. These activities can help to increase the understanding of the two countries' cultures and promote mutual respect. The Chinese government should also encourage universities in both countries to establish student exchange programs, so that students from both countries can gain a better understanding of each other's culture. The cooperation in higher education between China and Pakistan has been very successful in recent years, and both countries have achieved great progress in this area. The Chinese government should continue to promote the exchange of students and scholars between China and Pakistan, and further strengthen their cultural exchanges. By doing so, the two countries can build stronger ties and further deepen their cooperation in higher education.

Last but not least, this paper has explored the role of Pakistan's education industry in facilitating cultural exchange between China and Pakistan. It has examined the current

state of education in Pakistan, and the opportunities and challenges it faces in promoting cross-cultural understanding and collaboration. It has also examined the current state of China-Pakistan cultural exchange and the role of the education industry in it. Finally, it has offered recommendations for how Pakistan's education industry can be further leveraged to promote cultural exchange between the two countries.

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국문초록

파키스탄 고등교육산업이 중국과 파키스탄의 문화교류에 미치는 영향

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최근 몇 년 동안, 파키스탄의 고등 교육 산업은 크게 성장하여 중국과 파키스탄 간 문화교류의 확대에 중요한 역할을 하고 있다. 중국 정부는 양국 간의 고등 교육 분야 협력을 촉진하기 위해 중국 학생들이 파키스탄 문화, 언어 및 생활의 지식에 대한 경험을 습득할 수 있게 하였다. 본 연구는 고등 교육 산업이 중국과 파키스탄 간 문화교류를 촉진하는 데 있어 파키스탄 정부가 교육 교류를 촉진하기 위한 다양한 방법을 연구한다. 즉, 공교육원 설립 교류 프로그램 실행 및 장학금 수여에 대해 탐색한다. 이러한 교육프로그램이 중국과 파키스탄 간 문화교류에 미치는 영향과 고등 교육 산업이 파키스탄의 사회경제적 발전에 미치는 영향에 관해서도 연구하였다. 본 연구를 통해 파키스탄 교육 비즈니스가 파키스탄 학생들에게 질 높은 교육을 제공하고 경제적 발전과 파키스탄에서의 인적 자원 형성을 촉진하는 데 중요한 역할을 하고 있음을 확인하였다. 아울러 파키스탄의 고등 교육 산업이 중국과 파키스탄 간 문화교류를 촉진하는 데 어떤 기능을 하는지에 대해 종합적으로 검토한 결과 중국과 파키스탄 간의 교육과 문화 간의 이해와 협력을 통해 양국 간의 교육 협력을 촉진하는 데 있어 중요한 역할을 한다는 것을 알 수 있었다. 나아가 중국과 파키스탄 학생들이 서로의 문화에 대해 더 많이 배울 기회를 제공하였으며 양국 간의 문화교류를 촉진하는 데 있어 기초자료로 활용될 기회를 제공하였다.
